Rules for aerial platforms
WEF 2027

Rule (Art. 15 (3) of the Regulations TP WEF:

The use of lifting platforms that require the extension of arms or supports is prohibited in public areas within the core zone.

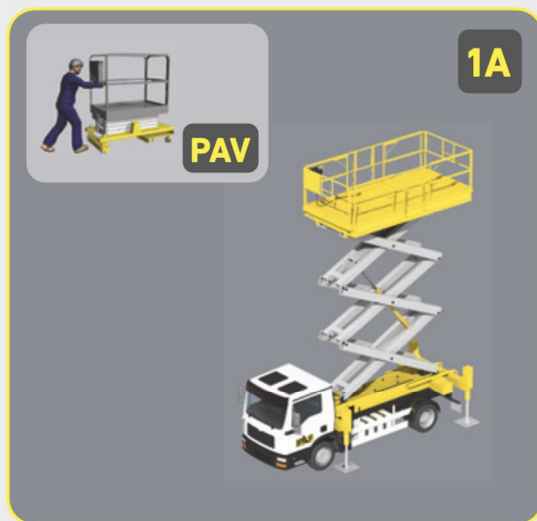
Recommendation: The restriction on combustion engines, which was still in force in previous years, is being suspended for as long as vehicles powered by alternative fuels cannot be reliably used during the Davos winter for technical reasons. However, the local authority continues to encourage the avoidance of internal combustion engines.

In Detail: Which lifting platforms are permitted?

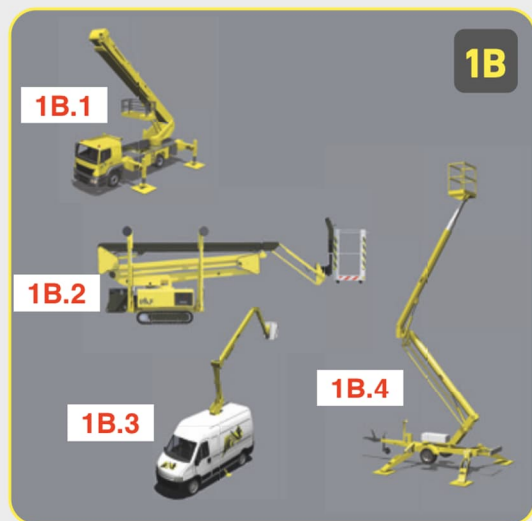
According to the International Powered Access Federation (IPAF), there are the following categories of lifting platforms or "Mobile Elevating Work Platforms (MEWPs)" (see www.ipaf.org):

MOBILE HUBARBEITSBÜHNEN (MEWP)

STATISCH VERTIKAL



STATISCH BOOM



MOBIL VERTIKAL



MOBIL BOOM



The following table explains which of the above categories fall under the ban and which are permitted:

Category	Admission criteria
STATIC VERTICAL (1A) Vertical passenger lifts (with supports) Push Around Vertical (PAV) Manually movable work platforms	Type 1A is permitted PAV permitted
STATIC BOOM (1B) Self-propelled boom lifts with outriggers, trailer-mounted and truck-mounted aerial work platforms	Type 1B.1 permitted. Supports/booms must be positioned as space-saving as possible and must not obstruct traffic) Type 1B.2 not permitted (the supports take up too much space) Type 1B.3 permitted. Supports/booms must be positioned as space-saving as possible and must not obstruct traffic. Type 1B.4 not permitted. The supports take up too much space.
MOBILE VERTICAL (3A) Scissor lifts and vertical personnel lifts (movable from above)	Type 3A permitted
MOBILE BOOM (3B) Self-propelled articulated and telescopic boom lifts (can be moved from above)	Type 3B permitted
